

## A Small Dot In The Big Picture

Pastor Steve in his June 1<sup>st</sup> sermon, talked about an artist who painted in oils, not by brush and stroke, but by placing small dots of paint on the canvass. Each dot a perfect circle of color. His painting was a landscape with people in a pack by a lake. Looking at the painting the colors all blended together to make a perfect picture. It took over 2,000,000 dots of paint to complete the picture. As a member of Grace Church each of us is a dot in the big picture. When you are not here the picture is not complete.



On Sunday, June 1<sup>st</sup> the Grace Picture began with 105 dots. there were 24 at 8:15 and 81 at 10:45. Sermon title "An Unusual Picture". Scripture from 1 Corin. 12:12-26. Letter "P for Pointillism" was our bulletin title.

Sunday, June 8<sup>th</sup> - our Pastor and Lay Delegates were at Annual Conference in Springfield, Missouri. Our painting faded some - only 70 dots were in worship. 19 at 8:15 and 51 at 10:45. Our service was a Hymn Sing of old favorites.

Sunday, June 15<sup>th</sup> - The sermon was "Q for Quixotic". 99 dots were added to our painting. 33 at 8:15 and 66 at 10:45.

Sunday, June 22<sup>nd</sup> - The Letter "R for Role" - The role we play in the big picture. The sermon was "Job Description". The scripture was Mat 16:24-28. 112 dots were added to our picture. The painting becomes more clear.
